Kay's Kitchen

I wish I could think of something really different for those of you wanting special diets during Lent. I can give you a few recipes not expensive, easy to make, but it comes to about fish, fresh or frozen, it is expensive, as is any fresh fish.
Here is a good standby, and you probably have everything right in the house.
SALMON LAKE CASSEROLE
1 lb. can salmon
1 cup dry bread crumbs or cracker
1 cup milk
1/2 cup saffron milk
1 tablespoon margarine
1 teaspoon onion, or finely grated onion
2 eggs, separated
1 teaspoon lemon juice
Remove skin and bones from salmon, drain and reserve liquid for sauce. Combine all ingredients except egg whites. Beat egg whites until stiff, fold into salmon mixture. Place in greased casserole. Bake in 350 degree for about one hour.

- WHITE SAUCE:
2 tablespoons margarine
2 tablespoons flour
Salt and pepper to taste
Inseparable liquid, plus milk to make 1 cup
Combine and cook slowly, stirring constantly, until smooth and thickened. Add about 1 tablespoon spices or season to your taste. Some suggestions: minced onion, Worcestershire sauce, dry mustard, chives, green peas.

Burley still being sold

Volume was the lightest of the season during the 11th week of Burley tobacco auctions. Cynthia and Lexington are the only markets still open for sales per hundred. Early in the 1983 Congress, legislation has been introduced that re-implements the general revenue sharing program for a three-year period at current funding levels of \$4.8 billion annually. Senator Wendell Ford (D-Ky.) is the original co-sponsor of the measure, which he says is vital to the operation of state and local governments. Calling revenue sharing one of the most important of all federal programs, Ford said, "These funds give local governments the flexibility to respond to the genuine needs of their citizens."

"While the federal government has withdrawn from the scene, local governments have the responsibility and can see firsthand the needs of the people. General revenue sharing enables local governments to respond to those needs in the most efficient manner." Ford noted that his experience as Governor of Kentucky showed him the importance of the general revenue sharing to states. "I saw first-hand the extreme fiscal pressures that were exerted on Kentucky."
