Besides all aluminum beverage cans and other clean household aluminum products such as pie plates, foil, frozen food and dinner trays and tin, packing and meat containers, the company purchases other miscellaneous aluminum items such as siding, gutters, storm doors and window frames, and lawn furniture tubing. These items should be free of any non-aluminum materials, cut to lengths not exceeding three feet, bundled, and not mixed with cans.
Aluminum cans including pop and beer, power lawnmower housings and barbecue grills also are purchased and recycled by Reynolds.
