IRS sends out tax packages

The Internal Revenue Service has begun mailing out 1,262,560 1983 and 1982 tax packages to Kentucky taxpayers. About half of those (656,779) will be 1983 tax packages and the balance (605,781) will be 1982 tax packages.

These tax packages contain blank tax forms and instructions on how to prepare the forms. They also explain what kind of assistance is available to help you in the preparation of your return.

Taxpayers are urged to use the peel-off address label which is affixed to the tax package. If your address or name on the peel-off label is incorrect, you can make pen and ink change right on the label. By using the peel-off label on your tax return, you will help the IRS speed up the processing of your return, and assure correct return identification.

The 1983 package also contains the new Form 1042EZ that may be used by many single taxpayers in the state. The new Form 1042EZ is a simplified tax return that requires only 11 lines for completion.

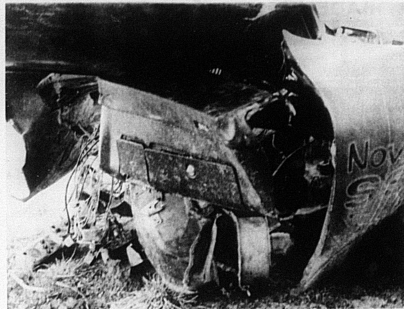
Disability Homestead Exemption

As a service to the property owner eligible for the Disability Homestead Exemption, I will carry the exemption over to the 1983 tax bill for those already receiving it.

However, each disability recipient will have to re-apply for the exemption by December 31, 1983, showing proof that he/she is still totally disabled and has received the disability from Social Security, Veteran's Administration, or Railroad Retirement for the 12 full months of 1983.

If a person does not qualify for the entire year, the exemption will be voided and the 1983 taxes due on the amount of exemption.

gradual and unnoticeable, it is important to keep tabs on how well your eyes see.

Injury is one of the major causes of visual impairment. Sharp objects, falls, clorders, blows, projectiles (BB guns, sling shots, arrows) home and work accidents are the leading cause of injury. Industrial eye injuries occur at a rate of two per minute and are the costliest in terms of lost production and earnings power. Safety glasses should be worn for protection.

The United States is in the midst of a home entertainment revolution. Video tape recorders, large-screen televisions and video games are readily available to consumers at reasonable prices.

The Better Business Bureau of Central Kentucky, Lexington, has a new booklet to help consumers sort out the various home video systems, what each does, how it does it, and how each dovetails into the other.

"Tips on Home Video Systems" provides basic buying information on video tape recorders, programs and tapes. A special section covers increasingly popular video games.

Consumers should get information about the warranty and servicing arrangements before purchasing, advises the Better Business Bureau. "If you are in doubt about the retailer where you will buy the equipment, call your local Better Business Bureau for a reliability report," notes BBB Executive Director Kathryn Goshkin.
