available for farmers to identify their fields. To be sure of planted acres, farmers can request measurement service. This is a valuable service not only to producers participating in the acreage reduction and government-kind programs, but to any farmer who desires an accurate acreage measurement for any reason," advises Mr. Kenney.

Crop certification is necessary before the farmer can request measurement and other program benefits. The AEC's official soil spring seedling crop may be certified Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

"We hope that farmers will report their acreages well in advance of the July 15 deadline."
