Kentucky Air National Guard deployed to West Germany

The 128th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing (Kentucky Air National Guard) has been selected to deploy to West Germany to participate in a short term tactical exercise named "Coronet Blotter." Two hundred and sixty-five Kentucky A-1 National Guardsmen and women and 12 of the unit's F-4 Phantom II aircraft will travel from Stewart Field to Ingolstadt Air Base located on the Danube River in Southern Germany about 90 miles north of Munich.

An advanced detachment departed Louisville on May 30 aboard a C-54 aircraft. The F-4C Phantom II mission aircraft took off on two waves of six at 4:30 a.m. and 5 a.m. June 4. The nonstop flight of about nine hours from U.S. Air Force KC-10 and KC-135 tankers. Other support personnel and equipment departed about one week earlier on a military C-141 Saturday morning.

Coronet Blotter is an exercise designed to provide realistic training in the European NATO environment. The unit will participate in a large live joint NATO air defense exercise named "Centinel Enterprise." This exercise simulates a wartime scenario and involves over 200 aircraft from various NATO nations and French air defense forces. The Kentucky mission will include flying precision target analysis as well as post strike damage assessment.

The unit currently normally pointing a mission, totally unannounced pointing has been revised for the deployment. The unit section was paired with a crew hovering over a laptop figure from a chase net along with the words "Coronet Blotter."

Along the flight under the cockpit is painted a Pegasus the flying horse and the name of a different Kentucky Derby winner bore on each aircraft. Selection of the Kentucky unit by the
