Kay's Kitchen

With school out you will be faced with the question of what to serve the children for lunch every day. For a quick, easy to fix lunch, it is hard to beat the favorite of most children, hot dogs. To vary this favorite you may want to try one of the following recipes. They are so quick and easy to fix in the broiler of your stove.

CONY ISLANDS
1 pound ground beef
1 cup chopped onion
1 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce
1 teaspoon chili powder
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
10 winners

Cook ground beef and onion, stirring with fork as beef browns. Mix in tomato sauce, chili powder, salt and Worcestershire sauce. Cook 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Heat winners and put in warmed bun. Top with sauce.

CHEESE WINNERS AND CHIPS
10 winners
1 cup grated American cheese
1 cup grated potato chips
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
10 winners

Sift winners lengthwise to make pockets. Stuff each pocket with a slice of cheese and baked ends with hot sauce. Broil 4-6 inches from heat, turning frequently, for five minutes or until bacon is crisp. Serve on bun.

DUTCH BOYS
10 winners
10 winner bun
Mayonnaise or butter
1 cup drained asparagus
1 slice Swiss cheese

Heat winners and place in bun with slice of Swiss cheese. Spread with mayonnaise. Add drained asparagus and slice of Swiss cheese. Broil, open faced, until cheese is melted and bun toasted, or wrap

lightly to fall and grill about 15 minutes, turning several times.






