ASCS warns farmers about chemicals

All farmers are reminded that tobacco treated with weepens, er dets, DDT or DDE after being transplanted will not be eligible for price support. Prior to the issuance of a marketing order for the tobacco, growers must be asked to certify whether or not any of these chemicals were used on the tobacco. Action to withhold price support on tobacco treated with these chemicals was made necessary because their use threatens the export market for tobacco.

Several countries that are large buyers of U.S. tobacco have set very narrow pesticide tolerances on tobacco.

The county extension service office can furnish information about acceptable pesticides which are effective in controlling giant pests.

Displaced Homemakers Project meeting June 21 at MCC

A group intake meeting for potential displaced homemaker participants will be held at Mayville Community College on June 21.

The intake meeting is to select persons for the Retail Sales Training Program, which will begin July 5. The meeting will be held in the college auditorium beginning at 10 a.m.

The Displaced Homemaker Project, a CETA-funded program, is designed for those individuals who have lost their main support of income through divorce, separation, desertion, widowhood or disability of the spouse. Many women in this position do not plan for the time when they will be full supporters of their families. They need training, such as the Retail Sales Training, to be competitive in the current job market.

The Displaced Homemaker Program helps to meet the needs of those people through career/personal counseling, vocational training, or work experience. The group intake program will explain the services offered and will conduct initial interviews. A representative of Manpower Services will be available to interview individuals for the CETA certification.

Kentucky lakes back to normal

Pass the word — Kentucky's lakes are returning to normal levels and most facilities are back in full operation.

The state Office of Tourism Development is receiving reports from operators that tourists are under the mistaken impression that many campgrounds and other facilities are still closed at Kentucky lakes because of high water, said Whitney Hallock, who handles state tourism programs as deputy economic development commissioner.

While some facilities are certain lakes were closed in May for a time, most are now back to normal. "We hope visitors will see that the water levels are still low and that the lakes are ready and waiting to be used," he said.

Kentucky Utilities to give credit refund

The Kentucky Public Service Commission has approved a Kentucky Utilities Company plan to make a supplemental refund by giving a credit on the bills of existing customers for \$1,807,134.66.

An initial refund was made in August 1981 for revenues collected from May 15, 1974 to June 30, 1978 in excess of the initial refund. It was determined later that an additional 50 percent interest should be refunded.

Total interest paid to customers as part of the initial refund in 1981 was \$2,820,817.

The average supplemental refund credit for residential customers is \$1.16. Approximately 137,000 customers are entitled to credits of less than \$1.00. About 15,500 customers will receive credits of more than \$1.00.

Funds are now available for restoration projects

Thursday, March 24, President Reagan signed into law a \$20 million supplemental FY 1983 appropriation amendment for historic preservation development grants. The amendment is part of the Job Bill Public Law 98-24.

The purpose of the law is to produce jobs quickly. Therefore, the emergency appropriation may be used only for development projects to rehabilitate, renovate, preserve and develop historic properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Kentucky's share of the supplemental funds is \$277,500 and will be administered by the Kentucky Heritage Council. This sum will be added to the \$20,000 already allocated for state projects. The Heritage Council, KY 40601, or phone 365-864-7000.
