ing the truly needy out of the cheese they should be getting, and cheating the government.  
As a result of all these problems, the government cut down the cheese supplies until the state governments could change their qualifications. Kentucky has, and the new requirements went into effect June 16. The new eligibility guidelines are based on financial situation rather than on age. Family income and size are the basic means of measurement for the new rules. One person with an income less than \$340 will be eligible to receive cheese; two people, \$433; three people, \$526; four people, \$1,058; five people, \$1,220; and six persons family with an income less than \$1,400 will be eligible for the program.  
I have expressed my concern over this program to Secretary of Agriculture Block, in the hopes that these new guidelines will get the ball rolling and we will soon receive distribution of cheese to those who really need it.

## Jewish Hospital Skycare expands capabilities

Dr. David Holland, Medical Director of the Jewish Hospital SKYCAR program, announced that the helicopter ambulance service was recently modified to accommodate two patients simultaneously.  
"The significant modification to the helicopter has been introduced that we may more effectively address the medical emergency needs of the region," stated Henry Wagner, president of Jewish Hospital in Louisville.  
SKYCAR, which began operation June 1, 1982, is Kentucky's first helicopter emergency service. Since its inception, it has transported 35 percent of its patients from outside the Louisville area. It was a natural extension of the hospital's program and service.  
By expanding SKYCAR's capabilities, the hospital can now respond to some rural and medical requests involving multiple patients. To date, Jewish Hospital SKYCAR has received 228 requests for service and completed 209 patient transports.

"The importance of SKYCAR has been clearly demonstrated," commented Dr. Holland. "In the remote involving our patients, our medical committee evaluated the first four months of the helicopter's operation. Several significant conclusions were rendered. The use of SKYCAR had a positive impact on the patient's condition in 41 percent of the cases. More significantly, a patient's condition actually improved during transport in 14 percent of the cases as a result of the medical care they received in-flight, by the paramedic and nurse on board."

Jewish Hospital is one of the leading general hospitals in the country. It is known internationally for its high quality patient care and medical specialties. In addition, it operates one of the country's largest cardiovascular centers and the largest hand surgery program in the United States.

Soon after making his diagnosis, SKYCAR had two opportunities for a double-patient transport. On May 20, two males were transferred from Knox County General Hospital, suffering from pike root poisoning. A few days later a 56-year-old woman and a nine-year-old boy were transported because of burns received in a house explosion and fire.
