he's up to 250. He needs to get stronger, but he's got a chance to play. He will say," Eisman said. "These may be a starting depth list. We had to put someone last season at all. With him and Smith back, it will make a difference."

Harris? I hope he's going to develop. He needs experience and the rest of year should help him. Right now he's second to Handy Jenkins. But I'm looking for big things from Bill. He just needs experience. But I can't coach."

Eisman summed up: "We had 19 regulars this year and the last two years we've been getting closer on getting the kids we want. So, I believe that two years from now you kids are going to say we're doing a helluva job. But listen, we've been working hard on this since we came here."

### Prospects

The just-in-state crop of high school senior football prospects is expected to be "about average." Topping the list is a trio of highly touted running backs: Mike Smith, a 5-10, 187-pound speedster from Owensboro, Ky.; Mike Higgs, a 5-10, 160-pounder from Lexington; and Steve Harrison, a 5-10, 175-pounder from Louisville. Mike Smith, who was named the state's best player by the Kentucky Football Writers Association, is expected to be the first draft pick by a pro team. He was named MVP of the state's all-star game in Lexington, Ky. Smith's coach, Coach Harrison, couldn't believe it. He couldn't understand it. I mean Bryant's Alabama team had won conference titles, national championships and bowl games. Why on earth would Coach Harrison want to leave, leave Alabama, go to somewhere like Lexington? Bryant's answer: "I want to get far away from coaches. I'm sick of them."

### UK basketball

Eisman understood now the reason that Kentucky high schools traditionally produce 12 to 18 quality football players each year. "Last year we got out just six of the ones we wanted," he said. "We need to be in Michigan, two to Arkansas and two to Missouri. That's our goal. We need a combination of size and speed."

### Rally the state

Eisman is confident that UK is getting closer to landing more of the state's best players. "We're doing everything we can to rally the state, make people aware of what we're trying to establish here. I think people really want to help. But until we win some games, it's hard to rally the state. But we're working hard and I think we're making headway. We've been a national power for a couple of years at the top of the state, when we got away last spring. Eisman expressed most concern about Kentucky's inability to recruit quality players from Missouri, Mississippi and Cleveland. "These are the three states that are the best in the nation," he said. "These kids are winners. They want to be the others on coach Jerry Chalmers' staff in future years. That's the only way to get their best players."

### Next season

"We've got a chance to beat some good teams," Eisman said. "I hope this season is a good one for us. There's a new coach, Chesnutt in on the scene in Ohio, Michigan, Oklahoma and Clemson have good talent. But we don't have enough quality players." "To get with Kentucky, Kentucky signed 28 players last spring. Will any of the newcomers help us get ready for next year? We hope there are a couple on there that will," he said. "That probability is real. It takes a year or two to get that ready for this level of competition. And that's how fast it learns the system is so important."

## Bringing out that patriotic spirit on July 4th

Brigham, Ky. — July fourth seems to bring out the patriotic spirit in people. That's why the Western Kentucky University secretary patriotism contest was held on Monday.

Her name is Betty Ross York. She not only bears the name of the designer of America's flag, she is also the daughter of World War I hero Sergeant Alvin C. York.

Daddy was a very patriotic man and he lived his life for his country. He worked for 33 years in the Department of Geography and Geology at WKU said.

York became a war hero in October, 1918 after he single-handedly captured a German machine gun nest and took 132 prisoners. Twenty-five Germans were killed in the process and 24 machine guns quieted.

"He only did what he felt was his duty," Mrs. York said. "He always said he didn't fit in here, that the Lord helped him."

Despite her father's heroism, Mrs. York said she and her family were "just simple country people" living in the mountains of Paul Mall, TN.

"We were just like any other children," Mrs. York said. "I'm proud because we were Sergeant York's children because we had names named after him."

"Some people will say, 'Heady! 74 it must be lucky!' But I don't really think about it much," she said. "It's the mountains of Paul Mall, TN."

Alvin said Grace York had 10 children: eight boys (five are still living) and two girls. Each, with the exception of Mrs. York's youngest sister, were given patriotic names.

Mrs. York said she never heard her parents say why they had decided to name their children after famous men. "I'm sure they did but I never thought about it. It's their names. If I'd been given any other name I'd had to live with it. But I really don't think about it (her name) much," she repeated with a smile.
