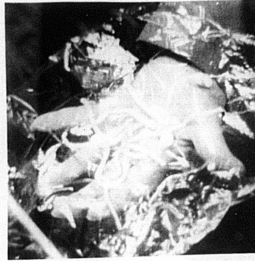

Barkley opposes crop support freeze

Any proposal to freeze price supports on domestic crops could be devastating to Kentucky farmers, said Agriculture Commissioner Allen W. Barkley II. In a letter to U.S. Secretary of Agriculture John Block, Barkley wrote that while he understands the President's desire to reduce federal spending, he does not feel that agriculture should bear a larger burden than it already has.

"I am especially opposed to freezing supports on the tobacco program because it is already being operated at no net cost to the government," Barkley said.
