**Some facts about your blood drive March 14**  
An average adult has about 9.1 pints of blood in his or her body. A liquid element, blood is composed of three major types of cells: red cells, white cells and platelets. suspended in a watery solution of nutrients known as plasma. Excessive loss of blood can create shock or even death, yet one pint of blood can be donated every eight weeks up to five times per year without any ill effects.  
The Nicholas County Blood Program was established to help assure that blood will be available for all residents who need it. It takes over 250 pints annually to do this. Since 20 pints cannot be manufactured, it must come from people who are willing to donate at local blood drives. The next drive for Nicholas County is scheduled for Monday, March 14, from 1:30 p.m. and from 8 p.m. at the Carlisle United Methodist Church.  
Blood donors are needed on a regular basis if blood is to be available at all times. Nicholas residents who must receive blood are encouraged to contact the Central Kentucky Blood Center, 1400-1826th St. Danville, Ky. 40402. Further information about the blood used will be dispensed through the Nicholas County Blood Program. However, those who have used blood will be asked to help the program to recruit blood donors whenever possible. This helps to guarantee that blood will be available for the next resident who may need it.
