

Caution advised on water

With spring officially arriving later this month, officers of the Kentucky Division of Water Patrol are urging you to return to their patrol of the waters of the Commonwealth.

"Spring will bring warmer air temperature and more boaters and recreationists on the water," says Water Patrol Director Larry Hatfield. "While the air will be warmer, the water temperatures will remain relatively cold for another month or so. We want to remind boaters that the cold water will continue for several weeks to be capable of causing hypothermia, or rapid loss of body temperature in the central portion of the body."

"If you plan to go boating we advise you to dress warmly, wear a life preserver and to observe all boating safety precautions," Hatfield said.

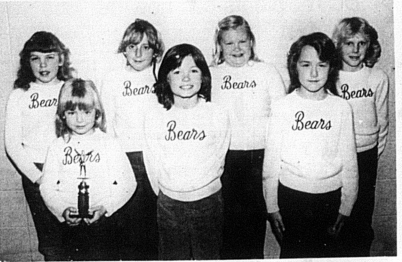

Gas prices continue to drop
The average price per gallon for gasoline in Kentucky dropped one cent at full-service stations and two cents at self-service pumps over the last month, according to AAA's March Fuel Gauge Report.

The average price for full-service stations now is \$1.21 for regular, \$1.38 for mid-grade, and \$1.55 for premium unleaded. The average cost for diesel fuel is \$1.19.

Self-service prices range from nine to 14 cents lower and are \$1.09 for regular, \$1.17 for mid-grade, and \$1.34 for premium unleaded. Twelve percent of the stations continued to offer a four-cent-per-gallon discount when customers pay with cash instead of credit cards.

tornado-producing weather," Buntin said. The tornado is frequently, though not always, preceded by southeasterly winds, darkened skies, rain, hail, lightning and thunder. During thunderstorms, watch for clouds that seem to be rotating from a central point and descending toward the ground. Sometimes observed by rain or darkness, the only sign of their approach may be the roar they produce, similar to that of a train or airplane. However if you have a racing eye, similar to that of a thunderstorm and seek cover immediately.

Tornadoes vary greatly in size, intensity and appearance. Velocity of the air can range from less than 100 mph to more than 300 mph. Most tornadoes have less than 100 mph winds but about one in three is strong, with wind speeds around 200 mph. Violent tornadoes, with speeds of 300 mph, are rare. But no matter the velocity, any tornado has the potential to injure or kill. Buntin warned.

"Because tornadoes may appear with little notice, it's important to review what to do if a tornado watch or warning is issued," Buntin advised.

During a tornado watch the National Weather Service when conditions are favorable for the formation of tornadoes.

When a watch is issued, be alert for signs of threatening weather, particularly from the southwest or northwest, where you would go if a severe storm develops.

Clear the area of any objects that might be blown away. If at home, clear lawns of outdoor furniture and trash cans and any other items that might become deadly weapons in high winds. Listen to a radio or television or NOAA Weather Radio for further information.

During a tornado warning, take a tornado warning means that a funnel has actually been sighted. Take action immediately.

In homes and small buildings, the basement or the interior part of the lowest level is the safest place to go. Go down, get under and cover your head with your hands and arms.

Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls.

In schools, nursing homes, hospitals, factories, shopping centers and large buildings, go to the pre-designated shelter areas.
