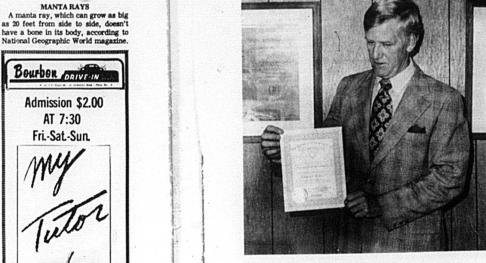

Fed proposes to sell Kentucky forest land

Federal Supervisor Richard H. Wenger, Daniel Boone National Forest, Wednesday announced recently that 38,584 acres of National Forest System lands in Kentucky have been identified for possible sale under the Federal Asset Management Program established by President Reagan. The purpose of the Asset Management Program is to identify federal lands that are no longer needed for federal government purposes. The Forest Service, nationwide, has selected a total of six million acres for further, more intensive study. These lands include isolated parcels, some lands in checkerboard ownership patterns, lands needed for community expansion, and some lands currently under special use permits. Selection for further study does not necessarily mean that they will be sold. Wenger emphasized, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, which administers the National Forest System, will soon propose legislation to authorize sale of those portions of the acreage ultimately designated suitable for disposal. Intensive study of the selected acreage will not begin until authorizing legislation is passed. At that time the public will be asked to comment on the disposal of those lands. Wenger said details of how the studies will be conducted, including opportunities for public involvement, are now being formulated by the Forest Service. Following is a breakdown of acreage to be studied: 12,500 acres — Daniel Boone National Forest — 1,500 at Drexel, 1,000 at Sledge, 1,000 at Laurel, Lee, Maxwell, McCrory, Park, Plank, Rockcastle, Rowan and Wolfe counties.
