Recruiting station commander appointed

The United States Army Louisville District Army Recruiting Command recently named Sergeant First Class (SFC) Walter H. Billings Jr. to command the Paris Army Recruiting Station. SFC Billings has served over 30 years with the Recruiting Command. After serving the past three years as recruiter for the Army Nurse Corps, he has been reassigned from the Lexington area Army Recruiting Headquarters to his present position.

SFC Billings is responsible for recruiting young men and women for enlistment in the United States Army from Nicholas County. Primarily he will be working with students from Nicholas County, Harrison County and Paris High Schools, who are interested in an Army enlistment following graduation. SFC Billings is a native of Blount, Va. He and his wife, Debra D. Billings, and two daughters, Start, age seven, and Cynthia, age four, are making their home on Route 4, Richmond. During his 19 year military career, SFC Billings spent two years in the Republic of Vietnam during which time he was awarded the Bronze Star, the Combat Infantry Badge, and the Air Crewmember Badge. Among his notable assignments include a tour at Fort Benning, GA; Fort Ord, CA; and recruiting duty in Utah. His overseas tours include an assignment to Germany.
