### To save or not to save!

Not another crusade! What are we going to be asked to save now — an albino Scotch pine that won't need to be felled for Christmas or a waterbed that sits up its sides when you cut it open?

Nothing so absurd. I want to talk about saving seed in packets, seed in pumpkins, and seed in peculiar plants that only grow at your place. Some should be saved, some shouldn't.

If you're like me, you have a collection of oddities, rather, dirty seed packets thrown in the back of a kitchen drawer or in the bottom of the refrigerator. Some are dated 1967, but some may last 1964, 1975 — 1977. Wow, 16 years old! Anyone for antique seeds? Seriously, how do you know which ones to save and which ones to recycle into the trash or compost?

The initial sorting is easy. Those packets containing the seeds or with a label on it, you can't read what it contains should go. Packets containing largely broken, moldy or over-irradiated seeds should also go. But from that first filter, look at the date. Most flowers and vegetable seeds can be saved an extra year or two, especially if they have been refrigerated. But for each year stored under household conditions, the number of live (or viable) seeds will decrease. After three or more years, many seeds will be alive to justify saving and planting them.

Also, look at what the flower or vegetable is. If you have seeds for tomato varieties susceptible to blight and verticillium wilt (fungi diseases) why save them? New disease resistant varieties are available. Their seeds packets will bear the designation 'F' and 'V' better to throw away a year or more of seeds than lose a whole crop to disease.

Those packets containing fresh seed that you decide to save should be placed in a clean jar or glass jar with plastic bag. Add a tablespoon of water to each packet, then put the jar in a plastic bag.
