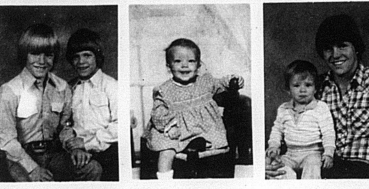

Marketing cards available

Marketing Cards — Barley tobacco marketing cards are now available to the ASCS Office. Before a marketing card can be issued we will need a MCHS form for the farm. This form is a certification for the following: the use or source of DDT, TDC, Transurea and endrin; tobacco delivered to the warehouse will be stored; and the agreement to contribute five cents per pound to the No. 1st Cut Tobacco Program.

Farm owners and operators are reminded that if a tenant or someone else is to pick up the marketing card a written statement must be on file with the marketing card will be released.

Accidents reported

On Nov. 6 at 6:45 p.m. the Sheriff's Department reports a wreck occurred on Highway 26, one mile west of Carlisle. Herman F. Hlander of Route 1, Carlisle, driving a 1982 Dodge pickup tried to avoid hitting a cow that ran across the road. Hlander ran off the left shoulder of the road, side-swiping a horse pole, and then went over an embankment into a curb. The truck was heavily damaged.

On Nov. 8 at 4:50 p.m. on Highway 21, 10 miles east of Carlisle, James L. Tisdler of Route 4, Carlisle, driving a 1982 Plymouth, was involved in a wreck with a 1974 GMC truck, which was pulling up the highway. The truck entered the path of the Tisdler vehicle, striking it on the passenger side. The Tisdler car was damaged on the left front end. The damage to both vehicles was moderate.

Also on Nov. 8 at 7:45 a.m. on Highway 36, three miles east of Carlisle, Jeffrey A. Owens of Houston, N.C., driving a 1974 GMC truck, was struck when Jerry M. Sadler of Route 1, Carlisle, driving a 1974 Ford made a left turn in front of the Owens vehicle.

Weatherization materials free to low income

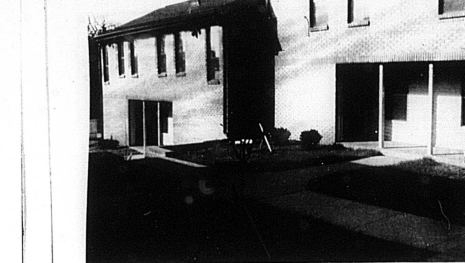
