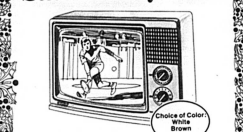

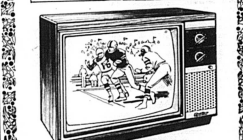

to know about it, though. They usually do."

"Sergeant," said I. "It's not a truck or a rail, where is all that smoke coming from?"

"Smoke bombs," he explained. "They always use them."

"Sergeant, I don't believe smoke bombs would make this building shake from the way they're used."

He noted directly they always go in books. "What's the matter, Kenne? You scared?"

I wasn't scared, really, just very concerned and a bit excited, but I said to him, "You're damned right I am. Sergeant. I pointed one of the planes in a pulled up and pointed sharply, although against a gray cloud. "You see the elliptical shape of those wings? I don't know whose planes those are, but I know that we don't have any planes in these clouds that look like that."
