For months the person is eligible throughout the entire month.  
You can apply up to two months before the month you want benefit to start. This will let you know if you get your first payment on time.  
When you apply for Social Security benefits, you should have with you:  
Your own Social Security card. If your claim is on another person's record, you need that person's card also.  
— Birth certificate.  
Your marriage certificate if you're applying for wife's, widow's, or widower's benefits.  
Your children's birth certificates if you're applying for them.  
Your Form W-2 for the last two years or a copy of your last two Federal income tax returns if you're self-employed.

Overall, the 13 cuts of meat were no percent lower in price. Eggs were sharply in price for the month, averaging nine percent above July. The prices of 6 cents for a dozen large eggs and 7 cents for extra large were the highest since December 1980. Dairy product cost averages were generally unchanged during August, although fluid milk moved slightly lower. Fruits and vegetables posted a modest two percent gain for the month, while grain-based foods were cheaper by one percent.

Leading the list of individual food items that showed price declines during August were ground beef, down eight cents a pound, rib eye steaks, 13 cents lower, pork loin chops, 12 cents below July, and tomatoes, corn oil and bacon, all down eight cents per unit. Moving in the other direction were extra large and large eggs, up nine and six cents per dozen, respectively, sausage, 11 cents higher for a two-pound package, chicken breasts, 16 cents a pound more, ice cream up nine cents a half-gallon, margarine seven cents more a pound, and Idaho potatoes, 22 cents higher for a 10-pound bag.

Greenburg turned up with the lowest local marketbasket average in August, while Dry Ridge posted the highest average. Overall, volunteers working through Farm Bureau Women carried retail food prices to 27 Kentucky communities.  
The local averages were Greenburg, \$1.25; Scottsville, \$4.89; Salversburg, \$1.25; Tompkinsville, \$6.29; Campbellsville, \$4.79; Brandenburg, \$4.38; Greenfield, \$4.45; Elizabethtown, \$4.86; Cynthiana, \$4.93; Glasgow, \$7.21; Morehead, \$4.65; Hopkinsville, \$4.22; Lone Oak, \$4.45; Shelbyville, \$4.91; Owensboro, \$6.07; Wilmore, \$5.28; Georgetown, \$4.46; Gremp, \$6.69; Louisa, \$6.87; Jackson, \$6.45; Stanford, \$6.54; Henderson, \$6.75; Nicholasville, \$4.79; Madisonville, \$4.99; Frankfort, \$4.88; Lexington, \$3.40; and Dry Ridge, \$4.49.

In the farm price area, weather conditions and reduced crop forecasts prompted sharp increases in grain prices and continuing declines in livestock price levels during the past month.  
The Kentucky Crop and Livestock Reporting Service noted the trend in its most recent report, and the grain markets have reacted strongly since then, with corn, soybeans and wheat all at season highs. Drying pastures and shortened grain crops have forced the sale of many cattle, causing those prices to slide. Hogs too have trended downward.

Analysts expect some slackening of grain prices after the beginning of the harvest, and few expect any immediate sharp rises in food prices resulting from the drought. They point to the huge carryovers from the past three growing seasons as ample buffer against shortages and the cost increases they would bring.
