A "delayed salute" goes to "nearly" Cliff Hagan, UK's director of athletics, for his decision last week to cancel UK's basketball game against the touring Soviet national team Nov. 22 at Rupp Arena.

The Netherlands National team will replace the Russian team for the Nov. 22 date.

As much as anyone else Mike Doucett, in an edition of The Sporting News, summed up the general feelings of Americans to the Soviet shooting down of a Korean airliner versus the proposed tour of the United States by the Soviet national basketball team.

"There are people who insist sports must be separated from politics," Doucett wrote. "In theory that premise sounds plausible. In practice, it doesn't carry much weight."

"Cancellation of the U.S. games would be no momentous setback for the Russians, but college sports officials have an opportunity to show the Soviets their American side as a desirable act and needless to say, UK may take on more of a positive role in the time to give the Russians a platform for showing off their abilities. It's a time to show them that Americans are angry."

Beal, Rowe update

The UK basketball team has had this fall training program led by the watchful eyes of assistant coach Mike Kelly. It is hard to believe, but the Wildcats will begin NCAA sanctioned preseason drills in just four weeks.

Sam Bowen is in. He's doing everything all the other players are doing. UK assistant sports information director Randy Stacy said last week.

Claiborne tickled

Kennedy (tophand coach Jerry Claiborne is, in his words, "tickled to death" with his team's early season successes. And rightly so. UK quarterback Randy Jenkins has been spectacular, ranking nationally in passing efficiency. Little wonder then that Jenkins' reputation as a reporter died in the eye last week and he believes every day he goes to bed and his an open receiver.

Randy's made good decisions so far. Claiborne said last week. "And he's done a good job calling his automats, checking off (at the line) of assignments. He's doing a good job of our offense, blocking with his knees."

UK's starting formation from an "A" slot backfield and vice versa has been productive all year.

"That's definitely helping us. I think the defense are having trouble locating it," Claiborne said.

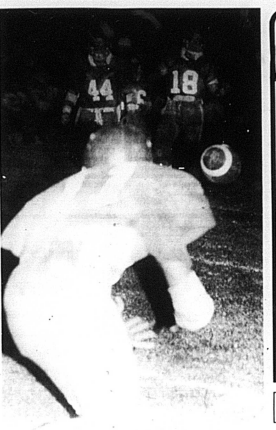
"Our players learned what to do when they're ahead," the coach said in the Kansas State game in which UK was ahead at halftime for the first time in recent memory. "We haven't had a chance to do that in a long time."

Under the heading "On the job training" this item about Jenkins' accomplishments at quarterback, Bill Ransdell, The Evans native got in for three series in game 2 against Kansas State. He completed his first variety pass a series, in the third quarter, but in the fourth, Ransdell threw into a crowd and was intercepted. Jenkins returned the interception. UK's next two offensive series.

I'd like to see that happen to finishers. Among his 128 victories are a record 79 in the minutes of defeat. Willie's fastest effort has been in 1:54 3/4, made as a 17-year-old in 1974 at Brandywine, Kentucky, in Wilmington, Del.

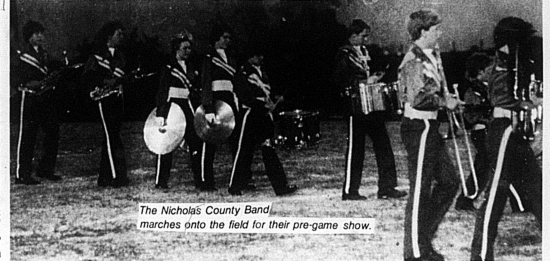
By taking a firm stand in theft cases and against cold check artists, Judge Arnold's court has brought a new era of protection to the public, especially to merchants.
