Workshop for teachers at Midway, Sept. 28
Elsie Malone, hailed as the national leader of the writing across the curriculum movement, will present a workshop for college and high school teachers Sept. 28 on the Midway College campus.

Further than focusing on remediation, the Beaver College model "looks about a higher literacy — about using writing to enhance learning and the learning process in all disciplines. This is the fundamental concept. Remediation may be necessary, but the goal is to teach writing as a means of learning and problem-solving method."
Colleges which have instituted the writing program employ strategies including writing assignments in mathematics, physics, chemistry and social sciences and humanities classes, as well as in the traditional English composition classes, Ms. Malone said.
Assignments reflect methods including multiple drafts, collaborative learning and peer review.
"The opening session, at 8 a.m. Sept. 28, will welcome participants on the writing across the curriculum program and implementation strategies."
At 10 a.m. Ms. Malone will discuss writing strategies for learning and problem solving.
At 11 a.m., the topic will be "Using Writing in a Science/Technical Curriculum."
At 2 p.m., additional uses of writing in non-English classes will be discussed.
A special 1 p.m. session will focus on the connection between high school and college writing, and is aimed at establishing a relationship between Midway College and area high school teachers.
Ms. Malone earned her bachelor's degree in 1969, her master's in 1971 and her Ph.D. degree in 1976, all from the University of Pennsylvania. She authored two texts, "Writing in the Arts and Sciences" and "Reading in the Arts and Sciences," and has presented more than 20 papers at national and national conferences.

medications, matches and tools out of the reach of children.
Keep play areas free of hazards. Enclose preschoolers' play areas to keep them from wandering into the road, field, pond, etc.
Teach children how to swim; but don't let them swim alone.
Lock your shop, grain bins, animal quarters, and chemical storage areas and make them off-limits to youngsters. Remove keys from equipment so children can't start the machinery.
Encourage youngsters to take part in safety activities in youth groups and at schools. Also involve them in such activities at home and on the farm.
While safety is a 24-hour-a-day job on the farm, I hope Kentucky farm families will take time during this harvest season — a time when accidents are most likely to occur — and lock over their safety practices." Barkley said. "Each child who is instructed properly in farm safety is one life that won't be lost in a farming accident."

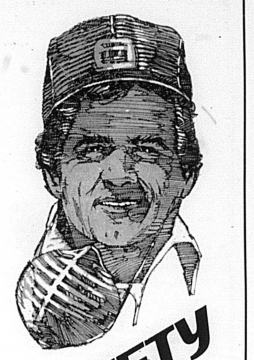

Cut, chop, saw . . .

Kentucky residents are being offered the chance to cut, chop and saw their way to the title of "Kentucky Lumberjack Champion" during the lumberjack contests to be held on Saturday, Oct. 1, as part of the Kentucky Logging Show, sponsored by the Kentucky Forest Industries Association and MSU.
Champions will be decided in five divisions, including chopping, axe throwing, chain sawing, mill skidding and crosscut sawing. The show will be held at Morehead State University's Derriksen Agricultural Center on p 1 e x, three miles north of Morehead on Ky-371.
The lumberjack contests will begin at 1 p.m. on Saturday. Those interested in entering any of the contests can do so until one hour before that time.
The contests will include various aspects of lumberjacking, and most of the cutting during the competition will be done on yellow poplar wood. The winners will be decided on such factors as time and the quality of the cutting. In the axe throwing division, competitors will be throwing a 7 1/2-pound axe at a four-inch diameter from a range of 20 feet.
The entry fee for Saturday's competition is \$5. If preregistered, the cost is \$3 on the day of the contests.
On Sunday, Oct. 2, the events will be repeated, but competitors from all states will be eligible to enter. The entry fee for Sunday's competition is \$10 if preregistered, and \$15 on the day of the show.
Other activities scheduled for the Kentucky Logging Show include demonstrations and exhibits on both days, the crowning of the logging queen, and a concert by David Priddy and Shelly West on Saturday.
