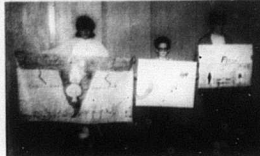




Tornado poster winners

Crop insurance deadline Monday

April 12 is the last day to apply for crop insurance for corn, grain sorghum and tobacco in Nicholas County, according to John Soper, District Director for the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC).
Crop insurance covers insurable loss of production resulting from adverse weather conditions, wildlife, earthquake or fire.

"Three coverage levels (60, 80 or 75 percent) are available for insurance protection. Additionally, FCIC offers three optional price structures for insurable production loss or damage," Soper said.

"TO ASSIST producers, FCIC will reimburse up to 50 percent of the cost of carrying insurance. For more

information about the program, producers should contact an authorized crop insurance agent." he said.
To select an agent, producers should check the list of agents available at their county AIC office. Applications should be submitted to the sales agent no later than April 12.
