## Kay's Kitchen

Recently I had a very nice letter from Mrs. Louis E. Chambers of Edmond, Okla. See "Letters to Editor" - She also enclosed the following recipe:

I have a delicious cake recipe I brought back from a visit to Louisiana and have been thinking perhaps some of your devoted readers might like to try it. Everyone I have served this cake thinks it is so good.

**APRICOT NECTAR CAKE**  
Mixes together 1 Duncan Hines butter yellow cake mix, 1 egg, 1/4 cup apricot nectar and 1/4 sticks oil, softened. Pour into greased and floured 10 inch pan.

Mix together until smooth 1 (one) 1/2 package cream cheese, 1 tablespoon lemon juice and 1/4 cup sugar. Spread over cake batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

Cool 15 hours and then turn over to a cake plate. The cream cheese sticks to bottom of pan while baking.

Mix confetti sugar and lemon juice to make a thin liquid and drip over top of cake with a spoon.

A friend sent the following Pickled Green Bean recipe, "to case you don't like the Pickle Bean."

**PICKLED GREEN BEANS**  
2 pounds fresh green beans  
1/4 cup white vinegar  
1/4 cup water  
1/4 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 tablespoon mustard seed  
1 tablespoon whole black pepper  
12 garlic cloves, split  
1 medium-size onion, thinly sliced

Wash, trim and green beans into desired lengths. Cook, covered, in boiling salt water 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 quart water) until tender. Drain
