KFB ponders legal action for higher import tariffs

Kentucky Farm Bureau President Mackey says he's "very much disappointed" by reports that the Reagan Administration will limit imports of tobacco and beef. Mackey says he is ready to pursue legal action for higher tariffs on the beef.

Agriculture Secretary John Block said last week that a new discount import program for five-year tobacco contracts combined with promises from tobacco companies to increase their purchases of U.S. tobacco this year, had prompted the administration to delay any action on import quotas at least until after the barley season gets underway later this year.

But "THE DECISION ought to be established by the exporting country. A preliminary survey by the Foreign Agriculture Service indicates that at least 11 nations are subsidizing their lead exports to the U.S., Mackey said.

Mackey said Farm Bureau will decide in the very near future whether to submit formal petitions for higher duties on the subsidized tobacco. Further delays in obtaining relief could trigger a new import tariff which Mackey says would be higher than the current one.

"SAVED BY THE BELL" CAMPAIGN KICKS OFF
The traditional Labor Day weekend will begin Friday, August 31 at 8 a.m. and end at midnight Monday, Sept. 3. The 1984 Labor Day weekend safety contest for Kentucky was set in progress and in the three day period 90 accidents were investigated.
The Kentucky State Police Dry Ridge Post commander, Capt. A.D. Fortner says state police will emphasize three programs designed to reduce accidents. "The visual display radars will again be used in an effort to secure voluntary compliance to the 35 mph speed limit."
The drunk driver is always a threat to your safety on the highways and we want people to call the state police (toll free 1-800-222-3000) if they spot a suspected drunk driver. "Fortner said.
