Here it is time to think of the New Year's dinner to bring back throughout the coming year. There's the important thing is that it be an economical meal. To most of us, that will be a welcome change from the rich foods we have had, really since Thanksgiving is start thinking cabbage, greens, black-eyed peas and some of the "leftovers".

Here are a few suggestions. If you are level of turkey ham by the time the New Year's Eve or New Year's Day party.
