CHERRY PLACING
 Heat one cup of red seed cherries with 1/4 cup of sugar, or to taste. Heat 1/2 cup of butter with 1/2 cup of sugar. Add the cherry mixture to the butter mixture. Cook for 10 minutes. Pour the mixture over the cherries and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes, until top is golden brown. (The butter will come to the top.) Cut into squares and top with whipped cream or ice cream. Serves eight generously. 1/2 dress this up a bit, add a few drops of red food coloring and 1/4 cup chopped pecans to the cherries before pouring over the butter.

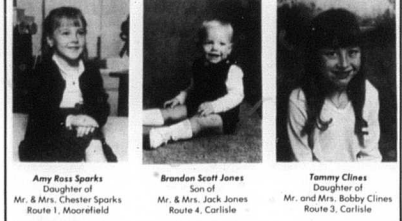

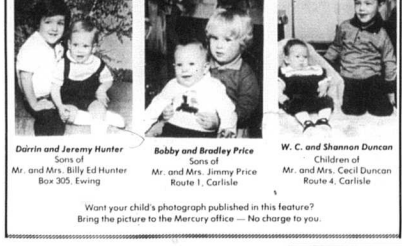

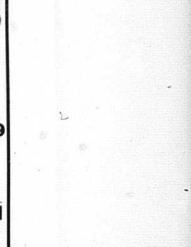
