Kay's Kitchen

With some spring days and a winter day every now and then, I am getting mighty tired of the same old vegetables and the same old meat, so I have spent some time looking up some recipes that give a new twist to old vegetables. So try some of them and if they don't spark a new twist...

- SPINACH-CALIFLOWER SAUTE: 1 head cauliflower, 1 cup spinach, 4 tablespoons oil, 1 medium onion, chopped. 1 cup water. Combine carrots, bread crumbs and cheese. Fold in sauteed egg white and seasonings to taste. Form into 12 balls. Roll in floury crushed corn flake crumbs. Place on greased baking sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 20 minutes or until brown. Set aside. Place the sesame seed in a large frying pan over medium heat; cook, shaking the pan frequently, until seeds are golden. Add salt. Turn and add the butter and onion and cook until onion is limp. Add the cauliflower and water; cover and cook until tender, about 10 minutes, stirring often. Stir in the green onions, parsley, sesame seed and salt and pepper to taste. Cook, stirring for 2-3 minutes. This is easy.
