passed on from the producer to Columbia, to Carlisle. An Vandandingham said, "There are several cities waiting for their gas contracts to be up so they can eliminate the middle man." He pointed out that the city will be purchasing two to three percent more natural gas from Columbia to replace the synthetic gas, but that it should be less costly.

Vandandingham displayed a copy of an ordinance passed in 1977 setting gas rate changes. In essence it states that when Columbia Gas raises rates in the City, those rates will be passed on to the customer.

According to Vandandingham's report, Columbia Gas projected gas rates for 1984-1985 are as follows:

The projected gas to be delivered in 1984 is 244,300,000 cubic feet. Vandandingham pointed out that the weather determines the usage in any given year, and that a projected figure is hard to determine.

Temperatures tall the Vandandingham also displayed a temperature chart (high and low readings) for each day in December 1983 and January 1984 which Gene Kelley, Sewer Plant Operator records for use at the plant. This chart quickly explains why so many city residents have had such high gas bills for the past two months. Mayor Hughes explained that three or four days of below freezing temperatures can easily amount to the same gas being used as would be used in a 15-day period of

'84 corn, burley acres to rebound

Kentucky farmers intend to increase acreages of major spring-planted crops.

Based on a planting intentions survey as of Feb. 1, Dave Williamson of the Kentucky Crop and Livestock Reporting Service says acreages of tobacco, corn, soybeans and sorghum will increase from 1983 levels.

Burley tobacco growers in Kentucky intend to plant 130,000 acres for burley in 1984, up 14 percent from last year. Acreage intentions for the burley total 131,300, up 18 percent from 1983. The basic production quota for burley has been reduced 10 percent while the effective quota will be up approximately 20 percent.

Kentucky farmers intend to plant 17 million acres of all corn in 1984, a 26 percent increase from the 13.6 million acres planted last year, only one percent

above 1982. If these intentions are realized, that would be the largest planted acreage of corn since 1959. U.S. corn planting intentions total 21.8 million acres, up 36 percent from last year, but virtually the same as 1982.

Soybean intentions for 1984 total 1,470,000 acres for Kentucky, up one percent from 1983. Planting intentions for the nation are 62.2 million acres, up three percent from a year ago, but down nine percent from 1982.

Sorghum acreage for the state is intended to be 50,000 acres, four percent above 1983. Burley acreage is expected to be unchanged while total acreage is expected to fall 11 percent.

All hay acreage harvested is projected to rise five percent from last year. Dark tobacco are expected to be up six percent, totaling 15,200 acres for 1984.

Burley averages continue to fall

Burley tobacco auctions were held at only six markets during the 10th week of sales. Volume was light and a majority of marketings continued to

fail. This week, Carrollton planned to sell Tuesday and Cynthiana and Lexington Wednesday. A cleanup may be held next week.

Corn sales for the week ending Feb. 17 totaled 1,361,754 pounds and averaged \$4.91 per hundred — down \$0.12 from the week before. The season
