

## Amusement ride safety Ag department concern

Thirty-two Department of Agriculture inspectors attended the Anderson County Fair in Lawrenceburg last week, but they weren't there to have fun.

They were learning to inspect amusement rides and attractions for safety compliance. The department's take on this new responsibility of safety inspections on July 13 as the result of a law passed by the 1984 General Assembly.

"This is the hands-on part of the training for our inspectors," said Agriculture Commissioner David E. Borewell.

The inspectors learned the midway of

the fair under the guidance of Carl Dick, an amusement safety specialist with 30 years' experience.

Dick, who will manage the safety inspection program for the Department of Agriculture, showed the inspectors the things to look for when checking the rides. He also instructed the inspectors about ways ride operators can "rig" machinery to keep it working though not in compliance with safety standards.

He shared the public's growing concern with amusement ride safety and was glad to be part of a new state law requiring rides and attractions to be inspected," Borewell said.

## Audit report compliments KU

The audit findings confirm that KU is a well-run, efficient utility with high quality service, good customer relations, and among the lowest rates in the nation.

The study which was ordered and paid for by the Kentucky Public Service Commission was conducted by consultants Harold Metzler and Associates, Chicago, and Paul and Associates, Raleigh, NC, and cost \$200,000.

The management audit report stated, "These results did not surprise

us. Management has worked diligently to contain costs and to improve its financial condition." The report also cited "staffing levels and salaries are low compared to other utilities of comparable size."

KU's average cost per kWh was 17.6 percent lower than the average of other investor-owned utilities in 1983.

The audit focused on all phases of the company's operations and identified some areas where improvement might be made. KU intends to study those areas for possible changes that could be cost effective.

## Crop prices down slightly

Kentucky farmers received generally lower prices for crop commodities at mid-June according to the Kentucky Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Corn prices averaged \$3.62 per bushel down from a \$3.78 per bushel in May average. This compares with an average of \$3.39 per bushel in June 1983. Soybeans averaged \$2.45 per bushel at mid-June compared to \$2.42 in May and \$2.45 in June a year ago.

Wheat prices were down from \$3.47 per bushel in May to \$3.22 per bushel at mid-June.

Hay prices showed a fairly significant increase at mid-month averaging \$49.40 per cwt., up from \$47.90 in May. Beef cattle prices showed very little change at mid-June, as they were down 20 cents per cwt. to \$45.70. Calf prices showed a slight increase to \$53.80 per cwt.
