ALL IN ALL, Bill Hardin, chairman of this year's festival, pronounced the event "the biggest and best in years" in terms of crowds and money spent at concessions.

"Both LeMaster and Huddleston told us they were amazed at the number of people on the streets during the parade and at the street dance," Hardin said. It would be several days before any dollar figures would be available but the festival officials are very grateful for the community-wide support and participation this year."
