Drought conditions causing crop stress

Crops remain in good condition over most of Kentucky. However, many areas in Nicholas County have not received significant rainfall in several weeks and are becoming quite dry. Barley and oats are at 70 to 80 percent, and moisture as of July 26, was reported 27 percent adequate and 69 percent short. Dry conditions have begun to stress crops to some extent, particularly in western and north east Kentucky.
The corn crop was reported in mostly good condition with 56 percent of the acreage at least normal last week. This compares to 57 percent at least last year and 58 percent on average. Ten percent of the State's corn has reached the milk stage. The crop needs rain and moderate temperatures as it pollinates. Droughtoppers are becoming a problem in some fields in addition to continuing problems with armyworms, corn borers, and root-

Trees theme of C-J contests

"Trees in My Community" will be the theme of the 1984 Conservation Essay Contest and the Kentucky Conservation Poster Contest sponsored by the Conservation Districts and the Kentucky Department of Education. The 1984 contest will begin in September. Detailed information will be sent to principals of all schools in Kentucky at that time.
The essay contest is open to all Kentucky elementary and high school students, and the poster contest is for school children in the state.
The essay contest is in its 14th year; less than 2 million essays have been submitted by students in various conservation classes. Contest rules will be sent to schools in the state by the end of August. Students are asked to make original posters with the subject of the competition at the theme of the contest. Essays of 250 to 500 words will be awarded to three state winners by the Lexington Daily Courier-Journal and three winners in 121 counties.
In the essay contest, students in grades seven through 12 are asked to write essays on one of the following subjects: trees, water, air, soil, and energy. Essays of 250 to 500 words will be awarded to three state winners by the Lexington Daily Courier-Journal and three winners in 121 counties.
