## Buntin, officials confer on earthquake

An earthquake from the New Madrid Fault, which runs from the Missouri border into Western Kentucky, could send shock waves as far away as the Eastern Seaboard.

This was the opinion of scientists and disaster officials who attended the National Earthquake Conference in Louisville June 3-4.

Representatives from seven states, including Florida, Carolina resident Dr. J. H. Boatman, executive director of the Kentucky Division of Disaster and Emergency Services, heard recommendations to minimize damage to structures in the first meeting of the new Central United States Earthquake Consortium, established in April by the federal government.

"NO MATTER what we do, there will be loss of property and loss of life," said a federal emergency agency representative.

To prepare for the worst, workshop dealing with hospital and medical treatment, protection of utilities and water service and the role of the private sector were conducted during the three-day conference.

While the greatest threat lies west of Central Kentucky, a degree of damage depending on the magnitude of an earthquake, could be expected throughout the state.
