Commemorative stamp marks Smokey's birthday

"Smokey Bear, the symbol of forest preservation, is celebrating his 60th birthday this year and as part of the observance, the U.S. Forest Service will issue a commemorative stamp August 1 to mark the occasion," said Donald L. Smith, chief of the U.S. Forest Service's National Administration and Promotion Division.

In an effort to promote forest stewardship, the National Administration of Forests is offering a Smokey Bear stamp and poster to the first 100,000 people to order the stamp and poster.

Each cover will cost \$1.00 and can be put into the initial phase of forest stewardship, a 70 degree or above, the animal is in hyperthermic stress temperature, a 70 degree or above, leaving just minutes in parked cars or against the heat in some parts of Kentucky, according to physical laws and the law of nature, it's a cruel thing to do to a family bear.

Don't leave pets in parked cars

Dogs and cats have more to fear from automobiles than being run over by them. Parked cars can kill pets too.

"Warm weather weekends prompt many people to use the family pet in the car and lead for the park, pool, or beach. However, a short stay in the car during which the pet is left in the sun can prove fatal to the animal."

Alan Worms, Extension community recreation specialist with the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture, says that the temperature in a parked car rises quickly and can reach 100 degrees in a matter of minutes.

The temperature in a closed car can often reach 100 degrees in less than an hour. Dogs die at 100 degrees in 30 minutes, while cats die in 20 minutes, he said.

Weatherization improvements for low income

The Cabinet for Human Resources is set to spend \$2.5 million to help the Department of Energy funds to make weatherization and energy audits of homes of low-income Kentuckians.

Cabinet Secretary Al Austin said the funds will be distributed to the state's 12 community action agencies, which will serve 119 counties, and the City of Louisville, which also serves Boyd County. "We will divide the money among the agencies based upon the need of the area each serves compared to the state need," he said.

Lynnda Sherrard, director of the weatherization program, which is administered by the Department for Employment Services, said, "This year, in spite of a reduction in funding, we expect to serve 1,211 homes. Based on data from previous programs, we expect 6,000 people, including 1,211 elderly and 160 handicapped, to benefit from this program."

Last year almost \$4.5 million was spent on weatherization to 1,807 homes, Sherrard said. "We served 8,300 people in the state, including 1,211 handicapped and 113 handicapped."

Kentucky Home Services served last year had annual income under \$8,000. Almost half had incomes under \$4,000 a year.

Work that may be performed on a home includes caulking, weatherstripping windows and doors, replacing windows, repairing walls, insulating ceilings, pipes, ducts, walls and under floors, repairing water heaters and placing skirting around foundations.

"Weather improvements are made depend on a home's condition," Sherrard said. "There is a \$1,000 limit on assistance in any home. Last year the average cost was \$1,300. We're not able to rehabilitate these homes, but we can make them more comfortable and reduce energy costs."
