- It's Girl Scout Time again and here are some good recipes using these delicious cookies.
- BROWNIE PIE**
1 Girl Scout Thin Mint cookies
2 egg whites
Dash of salt
¼ cup granulated sugar
½ cup creamed vanilla
1 cup chopped nuts
Roll cookies to crush. (If cookies are warm and chocolate soft, this slightly before rolling.) Beat together egg whites and salt until soft peaks form. Add sugar gradually and beat until stiff peaks form. Pour into a greased 8-inch pie pan. Spread evenly. Bake in a slow oven (125 degrees F.) for 15 minutes. Remove from oven and cool completely. Serve with whipped cream garnished with chocolate and/or shaved chocolate. 8 servings.
- LEMON CHEIFON PARFATS**
3 cup package regular lemon pudding
1 cup unflavored pineapple juice
1½ cups water
1½ cups vanilla whipped topping
1 pint fresh or frozen strawberries
12 Girl Scout Shortbread cookies
Combine pudding mix and sugar. Gradually blend in juice, water and water. Cook and stir until thick and bubbling. Cool, stirring occasionally. Fold whipped topping into pudding mixture. Chill. Divide half pudding mixture among 4 parfait containers. Reserve 6 strawberries; mix remainder into pudding and spoon into parfaits. Place cookies around edge. Top with reserved strawberries. Serve 6.

1 quart vanilla ice cream
1 cup mandatory whipped topping

1 cup chopped almonds, toasted
2 candied cherries, cut up (optional)
