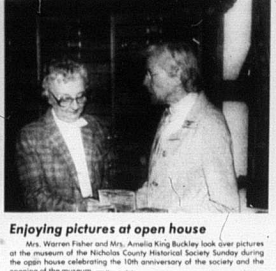
## Essay contest winner
