Thirty-three from Harrison RECC took a look at how electricity is produced at the Spurlock Power Station near Mayville on April 27. Included in the tour was a closer look at the landfill for waste disposal, the coal-fired boilers and other equipment required to produce the steam, the turbine-generators, the delivery of coal from the barges onto the stockpile and then onto the conveyor belts to the furnace, and the massive pollution control system.

Of the figures quoted during the day, two clearly stood out. First, five percent of the electricity generated at Spurlock Power Station is required to operate the equipment there at the power station. The second is that it costs out of every dollar spent for electricity \$3 required to keep clean air (to control acid rain, etc.).

IN OTHER BUSINESS brought before council:

— **Rev. Edward Hoger's** request for a guard rail to be placed on the Main Street and Dorsey Avenue side of his church to keep his van parked from driving onto the sidewalk as they make the turn at the corner and putting the basement wall into the basement.
