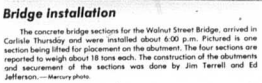

Pfc. Souseley monument dedication set June 3

A monument to Marine Pfc. Franklin Burton Souseley, who was killed in World War II action a month after being photographed raising the flag on Iwo Jima will be dedicated Sunday, June 3, in Elizabethtown.

Rep. Larry Hopkins and Marine Brig. Gen. Richard P. Traylor will speak at the 7 p.m. dedication. A two-year fund drive raised \$20,000 for the monument.

The photograph of the flag-raising was the most famous of all WWII pictures. Souseley was a native of Fleming County.

Pfc. Souseley's 28 year old mother, Mrs. Goldie E. Michael Price, will be present and participate in the unveiling of the monument.
