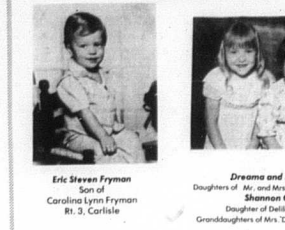
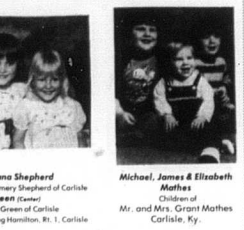

Plaint a tree

Ky. Garden Journal

Garden centers and nurseries hope to be busy this spring as people purchase landscape plants to replace those killed by last spring's rains, last summer's drought and this winter's cold. Landscape plants have been under extremely stressful conditions this past year.

No matter how good plant quality is unless plants are properly planted, money is wasted. Planting techniques that maximize plant growth while minimizing stress need to be adopted. While we've encouraged fall planting, we realize our water situation last fall caused many people to postpone fall planting. If you plan to plant new trees and shrubs, do so as soon as possible. Don't wait until winter and best start.

START YOUR PLANTING BY DIGGING A large hole. No other planting step can help more than a large hole with plenty of well aerated backfill soil. Dig the hole six inches deeper than the root ball or spread, and at least twice as deep as the diameter. If large equipment (such as an auger or backhoe) is used to dig the hole, especially in clayey soils, be sure to rough up the sides well. A smooth sided planting hole will be very hard for roots to penetrate and will result in poor growth in the planting hole.

An unworkable planting recommendation that has stood for years has been debunked by recent investigation. It states to water a hole in the ground with water before the existing soil, well aerated, the soil will be moist when you put soil in the hole.
