Kentucky's deer hunters are so busy with setting another new harvest record for the Bluegrass state, according to a preliminary check by the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources regional office, that it has had to postpone its annual deer tagging season, which opened Nov. 1 and ran for 10 days in most counties in Kentucky. 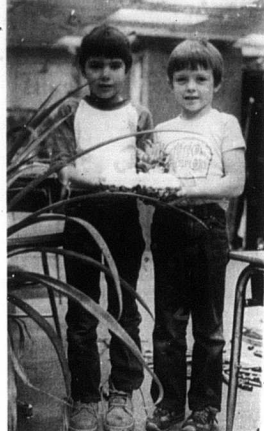
