HARRISON RECC ACCEPTS DONATIONS FOR WINTERCARE AID  
Harrison RECC has entered into an agreement with Wintercare Energy Fund, Inc., whereby Harrison RECC customers will now be able to make contributions to help their neighbors in need with heating emergencies.

Customers may make contributions to Wintercare directly on their current electric bills. While the amount donated, in even dollar amounts, is the same provided on the bill and sold the amount to the bill payment.

Wintercare will use 10% of every donation for assistance to eligible households in the community. Contributions are deductible on both federal and Kentucky income tax returns.

Community Action Lexington-Fayette County Inc. will determine eligibility for the program, based on at-risk status (low-income, elderly, handicapped or child) and will handle payment of utility bills for those who qualify. Assistance will be offered from Dec. 1 through May 1, 1985.

## In Maysville Tobacco task force sets Dec. 3 hearing

In recognition of the Maysville market area's tremendous impact on the Kentucky tobacco industry, a public hearing on the status of the crop has been scheduled by a legislative task force on tobacco.

Rep. Pike Worthington, D-King, a member of the panel, said the meeting will be held Monday, Dec. 3 in the Maysville-Russada Inn at 7 p.m.

Members of the task force plan to conduct a comprehensive and thorough review of the present crop program and its effect on tobacco producers and the economy of Kentucky.

Worthington said it is crucial that solutions to the problems facing the tobacco industry be identified immediately so they can be implemented quickly either at the state or federal level.

"It is common knowledge that the industry is now under attack on several fronts," he said, "referring to economic studies that link smoking with serious health problems, as well as the dramatic increase of imported tobacco being used domestically and the increased level of out-of-state assessment on barley tobacco."

The tobacco industry represents a billion-dollar asset to Kentucky's economy and is the state's leading cash crop. More than 70 percent of the farmers growing tobacco depend on it

for at least 50 percent of their farm income.

Consequently, Worthington said, the task force plans to become involved in changes to be considered in the farm program during the 1985 Congress.

"Because so many farmers from the Maysville market area are involved in the tobacco program, it is crucial for them to share their views with us," he said. "I encourage them to attend this hearing so that Kentucky barley producers can be heard in Frankfort and in Washington."
