JOHN CLEAVER JR.

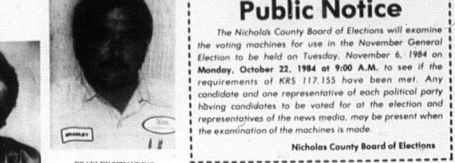
(Editor's note - This is the second in a series of articles, District by district, concerning candidates for the Nicholas County Board of Education. The same quantity was written for each candidate.)
