**Child support owers put on notice to pay**

The new federal child support enforcement law gives Kentucky additional means for collecting child support from delinquent fathers and the Cabinet for Human Resources plans to take full advantage of the new provisions, according to Human Welfare, director of the Division of Child Support Enforcement.

"Parents who owe child support should be on notice that the state plans to use every measure available to collect overdue payments," Williams said.

New sanctions include the ability to impose liens against real and personal property for past-due child support, withhold state and federal tax refunds, and to withhold wages after payments have been delinquent one month.

"Parents can no longer hide their assets to prevent their child support payments," Williams said. "If they are delinquent, we must bill credit companies if they cannot pay. Fathers of children whose paternity has not been established by the time the child is one year old have more time — the federal legislation extends the time for paternity establishment until the child's 18th birthday.

**Ag products average below July**

With only a few exceptions, Kentucky agricultural producers received lower prices at mid-August, according to the Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

At mid-month corn and soybean prices averaged below July levels and below levels in August a year ago. Corn prices averaged \$1.38 per bushel at mid-august, up from \$1.56 in July but down from \$1.56 per bushel in August last year.

Wheat prices averaged \$1.90 per cwt. down \$1 from July; however, the July average was the highest for any month since February 1983. Red cattle averaged \$44 per cwt., compared to \$44.40 in July and \$45.50 a year ago. Cows and calves averaged \$3.30 per lb. up from \$3.20 the previous month.

The August All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by U.S. Farmers was unchanged from July at 144 percent of the January-December 1977 average. The index was 3 points (1.6 percent) above a year ago. Compared with a month earlier, prices were higher for oranges, lettuce, tomatoes, milk and hickories. Offsetting were lower prices for cattle, corn, soybeans, broilers and turkeys.

The Index of Prices Paid by U.S. Farmers for consumption and services, interest, taxes and farm wage rates for August was 106 percent of 1977 base. The index was unchanged from July, but four points (3.5 percent) above a year earlier. Price increases for family living items and hickories were offset by lower food and fuel prices.
