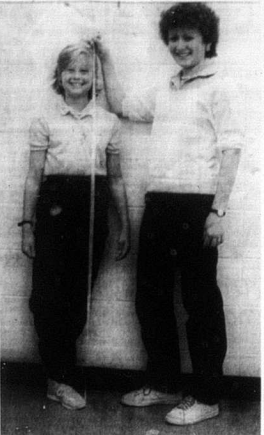

Arnold vice-chairman of planning, zoning
State Representative Adian Arnold (D-Mt. Sterling) has been named vice-chairman of a special legislative committee to study local planning and zoning.
In announcing the appointment, House Speaker Bobby H. Richardson noted the legislative interest in local planning and zoning activities as evidenced by the number of bills relating to the subject which are introduced each session.
"The statutes relating to planning and zoning have not been comprehensively reviewed since 1977. The special committee, created by a resolution passed during the '84 session, has been directed to undertake such a review and to report its findings and recommendations by Oct. 1, 1985," Richardson said.
Arnold, chairman of the House Counties and Special Districts Committee, will be joined by 14 other state legislators on the special panel.
