**Basic Types of Lenses**

Different visual defects require different kinds of lenses to enable you to see properly and function efficiently at visual tasks. Many optical features such as cylinder or prism can be ground into a lens, but most lenses prescribed fall into two basic categories:

1. Single Vision Lenses are used to correct nearsightedness or farsightedness, with or without astigmatism.
2. Multifocal Lenses contain two or more powers of correction. The bifocal, the most common multifocal lens, enables one to see near and far distances clearly. The trifocal has three powers: near, intermediate and far. There is even a quadrifocal lens for very special seeing purposes.

The newer progressive lenses are designed to provide clear vision from far to reading distances without the traditional dividing line of other multifocal lenses.
