 county-wide assessment is 96 percent of indicated market value.
 Assessing property is not an exact science. The International Association of Assessing Officers recently suggested that the market assessment is an indicator that may be acceptable if it falls within 10 percent, plus or minus, of market value. In other words, on the average, any given assessment rate (rate) may be 96 percent of 110 percent of real value and still be considered to be acceptable as an indication of market value.
 Nicholas County's assessment is 102.4 percent. Bath County 98.4, Boone County 94.4, Harrison, 93 and Robertson, 104.4.
