The theory that "no teacher can teach, and no student can learn, in an atmosphere where discipline problems distract any meaningful debate." A commission has been appointed to set down guidelines for a statewide code. The commission has been meeting and has adopted preliminary guidelines. There has been a considerable delay in their work due to the severe weather. They have missed several meetings which has slowed the process. According to the legislation, each local district will develop their own discipline code within the scope of the statewide guidelines.

In addition, new legislation filed includes a bill by Rep. Carlisle White, D-Bartonsville, that would allow Kentucky's teachers to take early retirement. The bill would allow teachers to retire after 27 years of service with no reduction in benefits.
