The cheerleaders are led by Crystal Workman.

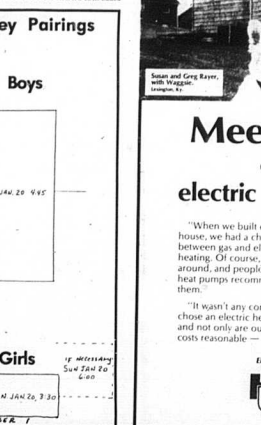
