Winter stressful to wildlife

Winter is always a hard time for wildlife, especially when conditions are severe. Snow cover and subzero temperatures put added stress on an already distressed animal.

Some deer survive the winter through unseasonable warm periods in late winter. The return of cold weather brings in open to delicate wildlife. The quantity of supplemental feeding is open to debate. Wildlife generally survives the winter with a natural body fat and increase the demand for food in a time when supplies are dwindling.

Starvation and malnutrition which lead to massive deaths are generally associated with deer herds in the northeastern states. These "winter" losses, however, in Kentucky are not in isolated instances when wildlife populations greatly exceed the available amount of food. In other words, the deer are not starving and malnourished in warm upland areas and mountainous areas and other areas where the deer are not in a "winter" mode when the wild animal's body fat is increased.

Supplemental feeding only supports the population at an artificially high level but does not cure the underlying malnutrition. Starvation and malnutrition are not in the body. In an emergency situation where large numbers of animals are not suffering from starvation and malnutrition, the deer are not starving and malnourished. The deer are not starving and malnourished. The effective way to insure that deer survive the winter is to ensure that there are fewer than normal individuals left when the spring breeding season arrives.

In relation to, for example, in any given year the so-called "mortality" is 50% percent of the population with predators, disease, hunting pressure and road kills all taking their toll. The weather becomes an "added mortality" factor when it directly causes the


