Motorists to pay more to travel

The 26 million motorists expected to take to the road over the Independence Day weekend will find that the average price of gasoline is \$1.04 a gallon - it is two cents higher than it was last July in the Blue Grass Automobile Club AAA sponsored.
Reports show that gasoline prices have increased by 14 cents a gallon since Memorial Day.
Nationally, full-service prices averaged \$1.58 for regular unleaded 87 for unleaded gasoline, increases of 14 cents and 18 cents, respectively, since May 21, date of AAA's last survey.
