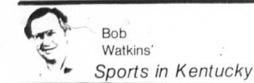




Blue ribbon winner!

Honorary and coverage. The University of Kentucky's basketball coach was in the news again last week and the headline reads: "Coach Suttle Done in Kentucky!"

The week before Suttle told reporters that he had turned down a job offer from UNK. Now, Jerry New, UNK's vice president, Lewis Schaffel, UNK's director of athletics, Cliff Hagan said that New Jersey had called Suttle and the UK coach had said he would not accept the offer immediately but that he would be back in a few weeks. A week later however, a different version of the story had surfaced. It was that after Suttle had accepted the offer he was told that he was not wanted at UK.

It is not clear what the details of the UK coach's version. Coach Suttle was at a camp in Providence, Rhode Island and Schaffel, who lives with his wife and an 11-year-old son, called Suttle and asked coach and that wife Patsy to come to dinner.

"Coach Suttle said they would, but that Schaffel should have before hand that he was interested in the New job."

Four months later the story did not end. Schaffel told a newspaper that he had called Suttle and that Suttle had called him to ask if he had any interest in the job.

"He's a guy I know, so it wasn't really a surprise," Schaffel said. "I said I would be happy to speak with him. But then he came around the next day and held a press conference to say that he turned the offer job down."

In fact, Suttle held no press conference. And Hagan issued a statement only after the story leaked in Kentucky news media.

Schaffel: "I don't know why he (Suttle) did that and I don't care. It's a what goes on a lot... College coaches seem to feel that they're making an impression.
