The Nicholas County Board of Education, at its June 10 regular meeting, approved the following:
* To enter into a cooperative project with KKKK to participate in 1985-86 Staff Development Project in amount of \$1,000.
* To enter into contract agreement with KKKK for them to provide pupil accounting, census services and career information in amount of \$1,200.
* To accept the resignation of Buford Campbell, bus driver effective May 28, 1985 at 3 p.m.
* To approve leaving textbooks for high school students at a cost of \$2,000.
* To pay all bills and salaries to close out 1984-85 school year.
* To adopt Factor XI for issuance of checks.
* To approve Master In-service Plan for 1985-86 school year.
* To authorize Sgt. Donald Elder to enter into a cooperative agreement with the Northeastern Bluegrass Educational Cooperative.
* To allow Danny Baker to take field trips to camp at University of Kentucky from June 23-28, 1985.
* To participate in the area Academic League during 1985-86 school year.
* To approve PTA requests.
* To make better insurance coverage to same level as casually insurance effective at renewal.
* To grant Ben Humphrey 30 percent of unused sick leave provided he makes the regular retirement contribution for members on each leave payment.
* To advertise for bids the following vehicle lubricants and accessories, bakery products, dairy products and dry cleaning.
* To allow James High and Senior High overlanders to use elementary school for a camp during month of July.
* To advertise for bids the remodeling of the board office.
